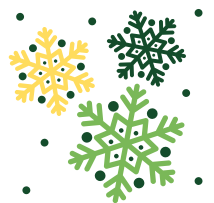
## END OF YEAR BUSINESS UPDATE

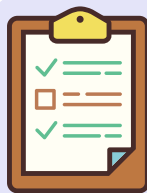
You all deserve a well-earned break and I hope you and your family stay safe, enjoy your time together and I look forward to seeing you all in 2021.
